

**Devin Peterson**, Ph.D. (dgp@umn.edu) is a Professor in the Department of Food Science and Nutrition at the University of Minnesota. He earned a doctoral degree in Flavor Chemistry (2001) at the U. of Minnesota. In 2001 he joined the faculty in the Department of Food Science at Penn State University for eight years. During his tenure at Penn State in 2004 he received the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE) that is presented by the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy as the nation's highest recognition of scientific professionals at the start of their independent research careers. In 2009 he returned to the University of Minnesota as an Associate Professor. His research efforts focus on food flavor and related chemistry

with particular emphasis on flavor generation, characterization of flavor compounds (taste and aroma), taste-aroma interactions and modulation, and flavor delivery. He is the director of the Flavor Research and Education Center at the University of Minnesota. Part of the mission of the Center is to support the food industry to develop healthier food choices with higher product acceptability.
