



Strietelmeier Scholarship Announcement for Unemployed Chicago Section IFT Members

The Chicago Section IFT will provide up to \$3,000 of Scholarship funds for individuals that are unemployed and seeking employment in the food industry. Scholarship funds can be used to offset expenses relating to attending the upcoming Annual IFT Convention and Expo or to offset expenses relating to training purposes in the form of a workshop, shortcourses, etc.

Applicants must be unemployed, seeking employment in the food industry and members of the Chicago Section IFT that reside in the zip code boundaries of the Section. The maximum amount an individual can be awarded is \$1,000.
