Report Submitted on New CSIFT Structure. Our Incoming CSIFT Chair contacted all Committee Chairs affected by the newly proposed structure and received positive reviews. CSIFT Business Office (IAMI) Report Lynnda Nelson
Report submitted. For Supplier's Night, YTD, CSIFT has sold the same number of booths as of this date last year and we have 5 new companies with booths. Our Business Office, IAMI, is finalizing a web based program for Supplier Night attendees to be able to search for companies or products and services prior to the event.

For the 2011 CSIFT golf outing, IAMI is putting out the first marketing email this Thursday. The registration price is the same as last year. The golf committee has 4 new members and they



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will have a lunch meeting next week. Committee Member John Fenstermacher will be announcing the golf outing details at tonight's dinner meeting.

New Business

IFTSA Fun Run: As a platinum sponsor of the IFTSA Fun Run, CSIFT was given 8 free registrations for the event. Michael Carson and Atul Khare have signed up so far and we will be soliciting for additional participants through May 17.

Dues: CSIFT discussed an increase to our annual dues from \$15 to \$25. A motion was made and passed for an increase to \$25. Student dues would increase to half the price of professional dues. This requires a vote from our members and will not take effect unless approved by our members.

EXCOM vacancy: There was a motion that Dr. John Budin be appointed to the EXCOM to replace the vacancy of Dean Lustig. It was unanimously passed.

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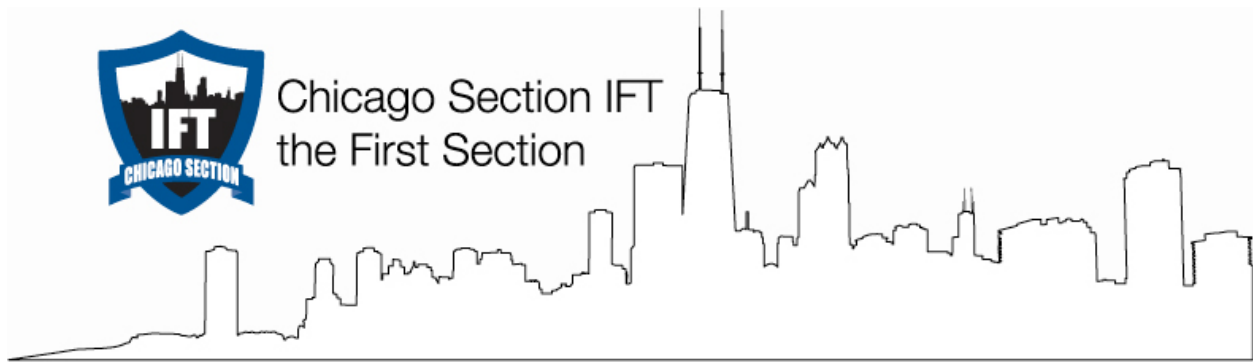

A. Compliance & Regulatory Analyst: Responsibilities include reviewing new formulations for regulatory and labeling compliance, provide guidance to manufacturing on blending or restrictions on blending, facilitate handling customer application complaints, provide support to purchasing for Vendor Management Program, participate in GMP and food safety programs. Position is located in Sycamore, IL. Requirements: Bachelor's degree in Chemistry or Microbiology, 3 – 5 years Quality or Food Safety experience. Working knowledge of SAP.

B. Food Technologist: Product development. Requirements: BS in Food Science, minimum 2 years (food manufacturing experience preferred). Culinary experience preferred.

C. Sr. Quality Systems Analyst: Reviews supplier documentation for adherence to established standards and develops and maintains internal raw material specifications. Collaborates with Purchasing and Regulatory groups, collaborate with suppliers to establish meaningful raw material specifications and develops and maintains raw material specification templates used to guide the development of new and updated raw material specifications. Requirements: Bachelor's degree in Science or Engineering. Minimum 6 years of Quality Systems experience.



D. Food Scientist (Medina, OH): Responsible for developing complex formulas, processing procedures and specifications for new products, product enhancement and cost reduction projects within a USDA facility. Requirements: B.S. degree in Food Science. Advanced degree preferred or a Culinary degree with a strong technical/product development background.

E. Regulatory Specialist: Provide regulatory support and expertise both internally and externally with clients to support the overall business strategy of the organization. Requirements: B.S. degree in Food Science or related field from a 4 year institution. 3 – 5 years Food Regulatory experience.

F. Sr. Manager, Supplier Food Safety (Bentonville, AR): Responsible for approving or disapproving the types of foods and food suppliers they are assigned to oversee by reviewing supplier's practices and results of third party audits, certifications and product test results. Requirements: B.S. in Food Microbiology, Food Science or related field. Beneficial Registrations or certifications include: Registered Microbiologist, Certified Food Safety Profession. Graduate degree in Food Science or related field is desirable.
